

Infants are born with a natural curiosity and a love of learning. By contrast, many children and adults have come either to dread or hate learning. Teaching has become the most stressful social occupation, and this is in no small part due to the fact that many children and adults are threatened by learning. Other contributing factors are a rising tide of discipline difficulties, low motivation, poor staff relationships, large class sizes, poor psychological and social back-up services, and teachers' own self-esteem problems. Teachers and parents typically make the mistake of viewing students' avoidance of or rebelliousness around learning as the challenging behaviours that need to be confronted. However, such an approach only serves to **escalate** these difficult **responses**. The real problem is hidden behind these ingenious protective devices and is about individuals' worth and relationships not being determined by academic and other learning performances. The clever purpose of the so-called "challenging behaviours" is to reduce or eliminate further blows to self-worth and security in key relationships. Unless there is a clear separation between loving and learning and person and behaviour; children and adults will wisely maintain their defences in situations when teaching threatens their emotional and social well-being.


