People in Europe and the United States are **going wild** over a number **puzzle** called "sudoku", which **evolved** into its present form in Japan. Sudoku's **popularity** in Japan was limited to a small group of **devotees**, but in the autumn of 2004 it suddenly **burst onto** the **scene** in puzzle-loving Britain. First The Times, a famous British newspaper, began printing a daily sudoku puzzle, and then other papers started doing so too. Sudoku was covered by well-known magazines, and as more and more people became **hooked on** it, books of sudoku puzzles became best-sellers.

The sudoku **boom** has now **spread** all over the world. The puzzles **appear** in **major** newspapers in the United States and France, and sudoku books have been **published** in a number of countries, including Germany. In Japan, reports about the popularity of sudoku **abroad** have **prompted** people to take a **fresh** look at this home-grown puzzle. Some Japanese **elementary** schools have even begun **incorporating** sudoku into math classes. The secret of sudoku's popularity is that while the rules are easy enough for a child to understand, solving the puzzles can be **maddeningly** difficult. The word "sudoku" is made up of two kanji characters – "su", meaning "numbers" and "doku", meaning "single or alone". The word can be **interpreted** as meaning "Only single-digit numbers can be used" or "Numbers can only be used once."


