The conventional banking system is based on the principle that the more you have, the more you can borrow. However, Grameen Bank, which is a private bank in Bangladesh, gives priority to those who have nothing, particularly the poorest women. The loans are small and repayments are made in small amounts spread over a year, with a built-in insurance scheme so that the family doesn't become responsible for the loan if something happens to the borrower. There is no legal contract between the bank and the borrower, and no danger of legal action if the repayments are not made - the relationship is based on trust and good faith. Repayment rates, on the other hand, are very high for two main reasons. Firstly, borrowers know that they cannot borrow again if they don't repay the first loan. And secondly, they must join a group of other borrowers who all share some responsibility for other members' loans and are encouraged to make group decisions. So there is considerable peer pressure and support from the group to encourage them to pay it all back.
