In a world heaving under the **weight** of billions of web pages, **keeping up to date** with the information you want can be really difficult. Wouldn't it be better to have the <u>latest</u> news and **features** delivered **directly** to you, rather than **clicking** from site to site? RSS allows you to see when sites from all over the internet have added new **content.** You can get the latest **headlines** and **articles** (or even audio files, photographs or video) in one place, as soon as they are published, without having to remember to visit each site every day. It takes the <u>hassle</u> out of staying up-to-date, by showing you the very latest information that you are interested in. There is some discussion as to what RSS <u>stands for</u>, but most people <u>plump for</u> 'Really Simple Syndication'. RSS are just a special kind of web page, designed to be read by computers rather than people. It might help to think of them as the free, internet **version** of the old-fashioned ticker-tape news wire machines. Not all websites <u>currently</u> provide RSS, but it is growing rapidly in popularity and many others, including the Guardian, New York Times and CNN provide it.


